WINGO SERVICE AT WORK

Partnering with The Lewis Perry Group and CDM Smith, we were able to help complete the Polynt Resin Expansion Project, which included a tank farm upgrade and upgrading the main service to 2000amp, on schedule. With this project completed, we can now focus on our many other construction projects; including Repcon/Covestro and the East Maintenance Renovation project at Kuraray for Dejean. Over at the Barker/Addicks Dam, the wiring and conduit for the Addicks tower has been completed and our crew has moved to do the same for the Barker tower. This project still includes lighting, underground electrical service, motors, and two precast concrete buildings - One for the emergency generator, an important fail-safe during hurricane season, and one for the equipment.
